- 3. The abstract should be between 200 and 250 words in italics, with focus on the purpose, methodology, findings and recommendation. There should be a maximum of 5 keywords below the Abstract.
- 4. Tables and all necessary illustrations, especially graphs and charts should be presented appropriately.
- 5. Articles should be typed in double-line spacing in Times New Roman (12 font size) on A4 paper, which should not be more than 15 pages. The 6th APA ReferencingEdition must be used.
